The Case for Vacation Bible School

"At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, 'Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?'

"He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them. And he said: 'Truly I tell you,

Before I moved to Memphis, Pastor Jonathan and I spent a lot of time in conversation about what I should expect at Trinity and what might be ahead. The church needed to hire a new music director. The church needed to come to a conclusion on the sale of a building and other various 'normal' church in's and out's.

Quickly I began receiving correspondences from you — words of welcome, questions about the kids, and **your** perspective on what the church needed when I got here. Your hope was that I would help Trinity re-energize its Children's Ministry program and that we would plant seeds for the church to have a Youth Ministry program again.

And we have.

Two weeks ago, 24 children — half of whom had never stepped foot in this church (and their parents), came to us for a week of Vacation Bible School. At least 4 youth from the neighborhood signed on to be VBS "helpers." At least 4 regularly attending church 'visitors' were here all 5 days to help members lead music, art, recreation, snacks, science, and a slew of others odds and ends so that our smallest disciples might experience a faith community and the love of God. Also, many of **you** were there.

That means we had at least 19 visitors, 5 days in a row last week. WOW! We must be doing something right or well or faithful. What an incredible blessing it was for us to have the opportunity to engage those children **and** their families in the name of the Lord.

I know it was a lot of work. It was months of planning, gathering, recruiting, begging, navigating, negotiating, and making room in our space and in our hearts to continue answering a call to welcome the little ones unto Jesus. As a pastor, I'm proud. As a (continued on page 3)

Partnering in Mission

One of the most beautiful parts of the structure of the United Methodist Church is that we are connectional. We share district and conference level staff with one-another, funds, and, when we do it right, we partner together in mission and ministry because, ultimately, we share the mission field.

That being said, we are being invited to partner in mission with former TUMC pastor, Rev. Jonathan Bratt Carle, and the youth group from his new church, at the end of July. They are venturing to Memphis for an immersion experience in our mission field. They will be here late evening July 24th through early morning July 29th. During their time here they will tour the Binghampton community and participate in a service project. They will check out Quest Ministries (in south Memphis), the STAX Museum, and the Memphis Zoo. They'll visit the sites of several Memphis area lynchings and get to hear about some of the history of Memphis and civil rights before they tour the National Civil Rights Museum. They'll see Peabody and Beale Street, Sun Studios, and the Cooper Young District, and their 'hub' for the trip will be Trinity. We are invited to join them for ALL of these things. For a full itinerary, please check the church website and the information bulletin board in the narthex of the church.

They will gather at Trinity for a breakfast and lunch which they will prepare and on the evenings of July 26, 27, and 28, we will have the opportunity to serve them dinner. If you, your family, your Sunday school class, or circle would like to host their group (9 youth and 3 adults and likely a few Trinitarians) for dinner at Trinity one of those nights, please contact Debby in the church office or Pastor Sara.

On Sunday (July 28th) morning they will worship with us and after worship we will have a big potluck lunch together with them to celebrate their presence and our partnering in ministry.
