Pastor Sara recently posted this thoughtful quote on Facebook. What this quote says is one of the main reasons I feel Room in the Inn is a critical ministry. We all know that the main goal of the program is to give our unsheltered neighbors a good meal and a safe place to sleep for the night. But, it is also an important opportunity for people to volunteer and learn more about these homeless individuals – to see them as fellow humans.

I'm not saying that all our volunteers are rich, but by comparison to those who are on the streets, we are all rich. Once you get to know Room in the Inn guests, it is hard to not have sympathy for all they are going through. It is easy for someone to say, "They made mistakes and now they are dealing with the consequences." Often their only mistake was being born poor. Sometimes an illness or job loss has led to their homelessness. There are so many stories, and they are all different. There is no room for judgment at Room in the Inn.

When we picked up our guests downtown last Tuesday evening, our morning driver, John Peeples, was there volunteering during pickup. He said he wanted to see the other side of the program since it was always his job each Wednesday morning to put our guests back on the streets. I had not looked at it that way before. He definitely has one of the most difficult volunteer positions for this reason.

Each Wednesday morning, I do think about how we are putting our guests back out in the elements. Sometimes it's cold, sometimes wet. Always there are safety concerns. Last week, I was struggling with it more than usual. As I climbed on the bus counting to make sure everyone was there before John pulled away, I said what I always say,

"Be careful out there." I paused a moment longer than usual. Several ladies looked at me like they knew what I was thinking. Miss Lois grabbed my hand and squeezed it and with a concerned smile she said, "Have a good day, Lois." Yes. Lois to Lois I think she knew what I was thinking. "Why does this woman have to live this crazy, dangerous, homeless life? Why do any of them?" I had to take some deep breaths and blink a lot walking back to the building to keep the tears away. The system is screwed up, but we need to keep doing the best we can to provide our guests with some needed relief.



Despite these feelings, I have made the decision to step down from the RITI coordinator position at Trinity after March 31. That will mark the end of seven years in this position. I've very much enjoyed getting to know all the volunteers and guests and having this extraordinary hands-on experience. I would prefer that the program continue at Trinity, so I hope we can find a new coordinator before the end of the season. If you have any interest in this or know of someone who would be good for this position, please let me know. I'm happy to share my knowledge with a new coordinator, because I believe RITI is a vital


