

"Listen With Your Heart"

Dear Friends,

This Sunday, January 31st, the choir will sing an anthem in which one verse of the poem reads, "Listen with your heart, God is speaking." This is an important spiritual concept, because our technological and scientific world wants to assert that the five physical senses are all we've got to tell us what is real. The poem, however, implies that we have spiritual senses – that the human creature experiences realities which are greater than the sum of what we can touch, taste, see, hear, and smell: *listen with your heart*, because your ears might miss the sound of God's voice.

During morning worship on Sundays, different people have been sharing their experiences of "seeing the signs of the Spirit's presence." This is a very similar idea: we see with the heart as well. So let us say that what the secular humanist will call a "hunch," followers of Jesus will call a prompting. What the atheist will call good luck, the believer will call providence. But this doesn't mean that I found my parking spot, or the last can of sliced pears, because God loves me. No – that is narcissistic, sentimental religion and does not begin to do justice to the God revealed in Jesus Christ. What I am referring to, rather, are those moments when we witness and experience that Love – Christlike, self-sacrificial love – which transforms the isolation of our fears, greed, and prejudice into community.

Last night I lay awake, my mind racing with all the various tasks and ministry possibilities that need my attention here at the church. I felt restless and overwhelmed and wondered how I could find enough time to be faithful. But then my fear of the unknown, my greediness for everything to go well, and my prejudice against all that stands in the way — all of this was transformed by a prompting to remember a snippet from one of my favorite psalms,

"...in the night my heart instructs me."

Here's the whole passage from Psalm 16:

The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup;

you hold my lot.

The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places;

I have a goodly heritage.

I bless the Lord who gives me counsel;

in the night also my heart instructs me.

I keep the Lord always before me;

because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved.

Therefore my heart is glad, and my soul rejoices;

my body also rests secure.

Dear friends, the world will ask us for proof, and we must be ready to speak of our spiritual senses. Indeed, we must heed the author of 1 Peter: "...in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you" (3:15). 





"Listen With Your Heart"

Dear Friends,

This Sunday, January 31st, the choir will sing an anthem in which one verse of the poem reads, "Listen with your heart, God is speaking." This is an important spiritual concept, because our technological and scientific world wants to assert that the five physical senses are all we've got to tell us what is real. The poem, however, implies that we have spiritual senses – that the human creature experiences realities which are greater than the sum of what we can touch, taste, see, hear, and smell: *listen with your heart*, because your ears might miss the sound of God's voice.

During morning worship on Sundays, different people have been sharing their experiences of "seeing the signs of the Spirit's presence." This is a very similar idea: we see with the heart as well. So let us say that what the secular humanist will call a "hunch," followers of Jesus will call a prompting. What the atheist will call good luck, the believer will call providence. But this doesn't mean that I found my parking spot, or the last can of sliced pears, because God loves me. No – that is narcissistic, sentimental religion and does not begin to do justice to the God revealed in Jesus Christ. What I am referring to, rather, are those moments when we witness and experience that Love – Christlike, self-sacrificial love – which transforms the isolation of our fears, greed, and prejudice into community.

Last night I lay awake, my mind racing with all the various tasks and ministry possibilities that need my attention here at the church. I felt restless and overwhelmed and wondered how I could find enough time to be faithful. But then my fear of the unknown, my greediness for everything to go well, and my prejudice against all that stands in the way — all of this was transformed by a prompting to remember a snippet from one of my favorite psalms,

"...in the night my heart instructs me."

Here's the whole passage from Psalm 16:

The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup;

you hold my lot.

The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places;

I have a goodly heritage.

I bless the Lord who gives me counsel;

in the night also my heart instructs me.

I keep the Lord always before me;

because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved.

Therefore my heart is glad, and my soul rejoices;

my body also rests secure.

Dear friends, the world will ask us for proof, and we must be ready to speak of our spiritual senses. Indeed, we must heed the author of 1 Peter: "...in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you" (3:15). When the world seems chaotic, violent, and lost beyond all measure, listen with your heart: God is speaking. Love will overcome the world.







"Listen With Your Heart"

Dear Friends,

This Sunday, January 31st, the choir will sing an anthem in which one verse of the poem reads, "Listen with your heart, God is speaking." This is an important spiritual concept, because our technological and scientific world wants to assert that the five physical senses are all we've got to tell us what is real. The poem, however, implies that we have spiritual senses – that the human creature experiences realities which are greater than the sum of what we can touch, taste, see, hear, and smell: *listen with your heart*, because your ears might miss the sound of God's voice.

During morning worship on Sundays, different people have been sharing their experiences of "seeing the signs of the Spirit's presence." This is a very similar idea: we see with the heart as well. So let us say that what the secular humanist will call a "hunch," followers of Jesus will call a prompting. What the atheist will call good luck, the believer will call providence. But this doesn't mean that I found my parking spot, or the last can of sliced pears, because God loves me. No – that is narcissistic, sentimental religion and does not begin to do justice to the God revealed in Jesus Christ. What I am referring to, rather, are those moments when we witness and experience that Love – Christlike, self-sacrificial love – which transforms the isolation of our fears, greed, and prejudice into community.

Last night I lay awake, my mind racing with all the various tasks and ministry possibilities that need my attention here at the church. I felt restless and overwhelmed and wondered how I could find enough time to be faithful. But then my fear of the unknown, my greediness for everything to go well, and my prejudice against all that stands in the way — all of this was transformed by a prompting to remember a snippet from one of my favorite psalms,

"...in the night my heart instructs me."

Here's the whole passage from Psalm 16:

The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup;

you hold my lot.

The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places;

I have a goodly heritage.

I bless the Lord who gives me counsel;

in the night also my heart instructs me.

I keep the Lord always before me;

because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved.

Therefore my heart is glad, and my soul rejoices;

my body also rests secure.





Dear Friends,

This Sunday, January 31st, the choir will sing an anthem in which one verse of the poem reads, "Listen with your heart, God is speaking." This is an important spiritual concept, because our technological and scientific world wants to assert that the five physical senses are all we've got to tell us what is real. The poem, however, implies that we have spiritual senses – that the human creature experiences realities which are greater than the sum of what we can touch, taste, see, hear, and smell: *listen with your heart*, because your ears might miss the sound of God's voice.

During morning worship on Sundays, different people have been sharing their experiences of "seeing the signs of the Spirit's presence." This is a very similar idea: we see with the heart as well. So let us say that what the secular humanist will call a "hunch," followers of Jesus will call a prompting. What the atheist will call good luck, the believer will call providence. But this doesn't mean that I found my parking spot, or the last can of sliced pears, because God loves me. No – that is narcissistic, sentimental religion and does not begin to do justice to the God revealed in Jesus Christ. What I am referring to, rather, are those moments when we witness and experience that Love – Christlike, self-sacrificial love – which transforms the isolation of our fears, greed, and prejudice into community.

Last night I lay awake, my mind racing with all the various tasks and ministry possibilities that need my attention here at the church. I felt restless and overwhelmed and wondered how I could find enough time to be faithful. But then my fear of the unknown, my greediness for everything to go well, and my prejudice against all that stands in the way — all of this was transformed by a prompting to remember a snippet from one of my favorite psalms,

"...in the night my heart instructs me."

Here's the whole passage from Psalm 16:

The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup;

you hold my lot.

The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places;

I have a goodly heritage.

I bless the Lord who gives me counsel;







"Listen With Your Heart"

Dear Friends,

This Sunday, January 31st, the choir will sing an anthem in which one verse of the poem reads, "Listen with your heart, God is speaking." This is an important spiritual concept, because our technological and scientific world wants to assert that the five physical senses are all we've got to tell us what is real. The poem, however, implies that we have spiritual senses – that the human creature experiences realities which are greater than the sum of what we can touch, taste, see, hear, and smell: *listen with your heart*, because your ears might miss the sound of God's voice.

During morning worship on Sundays, different people have been sharing their experiences of "seeing the signs of the Spirit's presence." This is a very similar idea: we see with the heart as well. So let us say that what the secular humanist will call a "hunch," followers of Jesus will call a prompting. What the atheist will call good luck, the believer will call providence. But this doesn't mean that I found my parking spot, or the last can of sliced pears, because God loves me. No – that is narcissistic, sentimental religion and does not begin to do justice to the God revealed in Jesus Christ. What I am referring to, rather, are those moments when we witness and experience that Love – Christlike, self-sacrificial love – which transforms the isolation of our fears, greed, and prejudice into community.

Last night I lay awake, my mind racing with all the various tasks and ministry possibilities that need my attention here at the church. I felt restless and overwhelmed and wondered how I could find enough time to be faithful. But then my fear of the unknown, my greediness for everything to go well, and my prejudice against all that stands in the way — all of this was transformed by a prompting to remember a snippet from one of my favorite psalms,

"...in the night my heart instructs me."

Here's the whole passage from Psalm 16:

The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup;

you hold my lot.

The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places;

I have a goodly heritage.

I bless the Lord who gives me counsel;

in the night also my heart instructs me.

I keep the Lord always before me;

because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved.

Therefore my heart is glad, and my soul rejoices;

my body also rests secure.

Dear friends, the world will ask us for proof, and we must be ready to speak of our spiritual senses. Indeed, we must heed the author of 1 Peter: "...in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you" (3:15). When the world seems chaotic, violent, and lost beyond all measure, listen with your heart: God is speaking. Love will overcome the world.





Dear Friends,

This Sunday, January 31st, the choir will sing an anthem in which one verse of the poem reads, "Listen with your heart, God is speaking." This is an important spiritual concept, because our technological and scientific world wants to assert that the five physical senses are all we've got to tell us what is real. The poem, however, implies that we have spiritual senses – that the human creature experiences realities which are greater than the sum of what we can touch, taste, see, hear, and smell: *listen with your heart*, because your ears might miss the sound of God's voice.

During morning worship on Sundays, different people have been sharing their experiences of "seeing the signs of the Spirit's presence." This is a very similar idea: we see with the heart as well. So let us say that what the secular humanist will call a "hunch," followers of Jesus will call a prompting. What the atheist will call good luck, the believer will call providence. But this doesn't mean that I found my parking spot, or the last can of sliced pears, because God loves me. No – that is narcissistic, sentimental religion and does not begin to do justice to the God revealed in Jesus Christ. What I am referring to, rather, are those moments when we witness and experience that Love – Christlike, self-sacrificial love – which transforms the isolation of our fears, greed, and prejudice into community.

Last night I lay awake, my mind racing with all the various tasks and ministry possibilities that need my attention here at the church. I felt restless and overwhelmed and wondered how I could find enough time to be faithful. But then my fear of the unknown, my greediness for everything to go well, and my prejudice against all that stands in the way — all of this was transformed by a prompting to remember a snippet from one of my favorite psalms,

"...in the night my heart instructs me."

Here's the whole passage from Psalm 16:

The Lord is my chosen portion and my cup;

you hold my lot.

The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places;

I have a goodly heritage.

I bless the Lord who gives me counsel;

in the night also my heart instructs me.

I keep the Lord always before me;

because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved.

Therefore my heart is glad, and my soul rejoices;

my body also rests secure.






Wednesday, Feb 3--Cantata Rehearsals begin (6:30pm to 8:15pm)
