The United Methodist Church General Conference

Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. 1 Corinthians 15:58

I am unashamedly United Methodist. You've heard me say it

before. You'll probably hear me say it again. The UMC has my heart and has for a long time (much longer for some of you). I believe that we have the best organized practicing body of faith that there is. We are connectional, not just in theory, but in reality. We have agencies across the globe that make an actual difference in the world (GBHEM, GBCS, GBD, UMCOR, UMM, UWF, UMDM). We have acronyms! United Methodists have the best hymnal and best uniquely UM hymns. Charles Wesley is all ours. We know how to EAT. The joke is that wherever two or more Methodists are gathered, a chicken shall die. Our liturgies for Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Baptism are beautiful, inclusive, and inviting. Our understanding of grace and how it moves us on to perfection in love is wholly salvific and unique to our denomination. I love (love, love) the United Methodist Church.

I'm also pretty proud to be a part of it and to be a part of it, with you, in this season of life for the Church. We are not perfect, but we can love perfectly, and as a denomination we can make effective changes that will move us closer and closer to being a church that edifies a Kingdom ethic in our time across the globe.

The only body of the Church that can make denominational changes is the General Conference — a global convening of delegates from each annual conference in our denomination that gathers every four years to review legislation submitted by UM's, to pray, to worship, and to vote. For the first time in the history of the Church, we haven't convened since the called General Conference of 2019. The Covid-19 pandemic made it so that delegates could not gather in May of 2020 and the conference was postponed (more than once). Even as things looked clear to convene in the U.S., delegates from places like Africa could not travel to the conference. The conference is far too large to meet digitally and there are places in our world that are represented in person that would not have had the technology if the conference were digital. A global church, while beautiful, at times creates challenges, and this one is the most challenging our Church has ever seen. Finally, however, here – on the other side of the pandemic – we are able to gather.

The postponed General Conference of 2020 will be held this April 23rd through May 3rd in Charlotte, NC. Since this is a postponed 2020 conference, instead of a 'new' 2024 conference, the delegation elected in 2019 at the legacy Memphis Annual Conference will be your delegation at this one.

Five years ago when I was elected the second reserve delegate to Jurisdictional Conference (the very last delegation position — way down the ladder), I knew that, as a 2nd reserve to the jurisdictional gathering, it was very unlikely I'd attend General Conference. But, much has changed. Not only did we see death in our delegation due to Covid-19, we also suffered the loss of the Rev. Dr. Autura Eason-Williams. We saw loss amid our delegation due to disaffiliation. We had at least one delegate step down in order to "allow for those

who will inherit the church these decisions creates [younger delegates] to have more of a voice." And, as recently as last week, we had a clergy delegate recuse herself due to family health matters. Somehow, in 5 years, I have moved from the very bottom of the delegation list, to the 3rd clergy position. Therefore, I will be attending General Conference.

What does that mean? Well, it means I'll be gone April 22nd through May 4th and out of pocket. That means 10-12 hour days of legislative work and carrying the emotional weight of the decisions we'll be making. That means over the next 11 weeks, I'll be spending much of my time pouring over 400 pages of proposed legislation. That means I'll likely witness protests/demonstrations of United Methodists for or against different matters related to human sexuality. That means our Church will be in the news. That means I'll be poised and positioned to make, what I hope and pray will be, the most positive shifts necessary to see our Church continue to be, what I truly believe, is the most wonderful representation of a church that edifies the work and ministry of Jesus for our world.

I really do want to ask for your prayers. It is both an honor and a daunting task that looms, to be called to serve this way. I ask you to pray for the work of the General Conference — for the delegates that will travel from every continent to meet and work — for the delegates of the legacy Memphis and Tennessee Annual Conferences as we resurrect our old conference lines to represent you and the Church we each love. Pray for us. Pray for me as I am praying for you.

Additionally, new signage will be posted on exterior doors, in particular the main front and back entrances, which are controlled electronically.

Also, everyone is asked to make sure that only appropriate lights are left on when leaving the building. It has been noted that lights are left on in the hallway on the main floor and upstairs, even when there is no one in the building. Every child needs to bring his/her own basket, but we will provide plastic grocery bags for those who forget to bring their baskets. The Easter Bunny will be

hopping by to join us once again, offering stuffed eggs and photo ops for the children and their families. Many thanks to the Evergreen Historic District Association for partnering with us again on this joyful event! The hunt will begin promptly at 2:00, so parents and grandparents need to get their children to the hunt early, not late! We always have extra eggs on hand to give to late arrivals, but the expression "the fun is in the hunt" most definitely applies to this affair. The event will take place rain or shine. It will happen inside the building, should we have a rainy day.

As always, there's much to be done in preparation for the big day, and we need your help! Please begin inviting family, friends, and neighbors right now. If you do Facebook, the event will be posted on the Trinity UMC Facebook page; share the good news with others through your own Facebook page. 
Kroger Rewards
