I don't like roller coasters. I really don't. I only marginally liked them as a small person and liked them less as a teenager and now I'll bite the bullet and ride SOME of them with the kids. There are rules, though. I won't ride anything that goes upside down, and I won't ride anything where you hang instead of sit. Those are a hard pass for me.

I don't like being jerked around. I don't believe we were meant to soar through the air (sans airplane rides, and I'm not incredibly fond of those either). I cannot imagine anyone actually enjoying their equilibrium being shaken, stirred, and poured out.

I enjoy the calm predictability of NOT being on a roller coaster. I enjoy my feet planted on the ground. I enjoy not feeling compelled to scream for all the reasons one screams while on a roller coaster (fear, anxiety, adrenaline).

I recognize, though, that sometimes life can feel like a roller coaster ride. It really can. We think we can predict what's next and, all the sudden, everything drops from under our feet or our world turns upside down. We may feel like screaming, running away, being sick...There is a violent shaking, or everything feels like it's going too fast, or (and this happens a lot) we're going backward! I've had a lot of moments like that in my life. After five+ years with you, I can say that I know you have too.

No one likes that, even the avid roller coaster riders. We want stability. We crave predictability or, at the very least, comfort, and life doesn't always offer that.

Many United Methodists, and maybe you're some of them, are feeling the onset of the effects of being a United Methodist in this strange season we're in — a season marked by splintering and fragmenting. It sure feels like a roller coaster ride. It's full of unpredictability. What we've always known, and the Methodist Church has a long history, is dissipating and there's no good way for us to know for sure what it'll look like in the years to come.

As someone who's (only) served a church for 12 years, I can tell you that it certainly feels like a backward run. As someone committed to an itinerate life and bound by the rules of a book that most certainly is NOT the Holy Bible, I'll tell you that it feels like a jumbled up, shaken, and stirred mess — and one WE created.

But it's not only that — a shaken and stirred mess that's our own fault — because Sunday morning comes... and we gather to read scripture and pray. We come, faithful Methodists, to sing 4-part harmonies we've known by heart for decades. We break the bread and lift the chalice. The only real chaos is the children's time, and still our hearts are strangely warmed because, if nothing else, they are there, and that is a sign of stability and life.

Amid the chaos that is the greater church, in our space and the space that is our togetherness, there is peace like a river. There is a happy mixture of tradition that is comforting, alongside creative newness that breathes life. There is a faithful struggle, but it is only this insomuch as we are TRYING to stretch, and grow, and better discern God's hopes for us, in an upcycled education building turned worship Center, on the corner of Evergreen and Galloway.

I've said it for nearly six years and I'll continue to do so. Despite everything else moving a million miles an hour around us, in spite of the sudden drops and sharp turns, even if it takes us (gulp*) hanging upside down or backward, God is not finished with us yet. God is already there, in whatever is to come. At the same time, God is with us — always.








Support the Lakeshore Scholarship Fund

It was not the number of kids, although six is a pretty good turnout for our class now, but it was their SIZE! They are all getting to be such big kids! Then, Sunday before last, as our children and youth helped fill the lunch bags for Peace Lutheran Church's ministry for marginalized

neighbors, I looked at our three youth who were there. Last year they were still with us in our class, and this year they have moved up to the new Youth Group. I couldn't believe how much they had grown, too. For all our children and youth, it's not just their growth in size that's impressive. It's their growth in so many other wonderful ways.

Our three youth are near the age that Jesus was in the story in Luke 2:41-52 about Jesus as a boy in the temple. This is the only story in the Bible about the childhood life of Jesus. Mary and Joseph thought they had lost their son, but Jesus was right where he knew God wanted him to be. Jesus already knew He was God's son, but he was growing as a human at the same time. The last two sentences of this scripture are some of my favorite words in the Bible: "His mother treasured up all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and man." There are so many memories that I treasure of "my children," both as a teacher and as a grandmother. My prayer for my own grandchildren, as well as the children and youth of Trinity Church, is that they will all continue to grow in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and their fellow man.

Financial Report as of December 31, 2022

As of December 31, 2022, our 2022 total expenses exceeded our revenues by (\$22,245). Pledged giving YTD was \$118,615 and slightly over budget by \$6,595. This is a great improvement from earlier months. Non-pledged giving was well over budget by \$10,720, thanks to some unexpected yearend giving by some of our members. Of note, Loose Offering is \$1,572 over budget and Memorials & Bequests were over budget by \$5,110.

On the expense side, we were under budget in Administrative & General by \$7,238, primarily due to limited use of the minister's reimbursable accounts - Continuing Education and Professional Reimbursables as well as minimal use of the Medical Reimbursement line item. We were over budget in Maintenance & Operations by \$7,022, once again due to Parsonage Expense bathroom overhaul (over \$4,465) and HVAC Maintenance (\$6,924). Program expenses were slightly over budget by \$143.

As of December 31, 2022, we have net unrestricted cash available of \$11,461, a real improvement since 10/31/22. Thanks to several large unbudgeted donations, we are in a much better cash position. This means we have gone into 2023 with \$11,461 in excess cash. We also did not have to draw any funds from the Endowment Fund.

Although we still had a net loss for 2022 of (\$11,245), it should be noted that we were well under the original projected loss for 2022 of (\$40,000). Hallelujah!!

All in all, 2022 ended on a high note financially.

In preparing the budget for 2023, Craig Jordan and I used a total of \$117,020 for pledged giving and \$46,800 for non-pledged giving. As of 1/11/2023, we only have \$61,300 in pledges, woefully short of what the church needs. In some cases, previously pledged givers will continue their giving but as non-pledged giving. So, although the non-pledged giving should be higher than budgeted, the pledged giving will be much less. We have not gotten responses from several people and will follow up with them soon.
