The Journey to Jerusalem

The Journey to the Heart

Fellow Travelers,

Lent has been a most interesting journey for me. When we began this journey at Trinity UMC, I advocated not the giving up of something – though this may well prove fruitful – but the taking on of the spiritual practice of Sabbath. The pastoral idea continues to be that if we do not make space in our lives for God, we may acquire the outward trappings of religion without the inward grace of life with God. I have found in these busy weeks that keeping the Sabbath is not something I'm used to, nor something at which I'm particularly proficient. What I have discovered is that I cannot undo a lifetime of spiritual malpractice in 40 days. So where do we go from here?

It seems that the most fruitful Lenten practices are not those which have for their punctuation that self-congratulatory moment when we check "participating in Lent" off our list. Rather, fruitful practices are those which begin to reshape our former lives into the life of discipleship – for good. The idea of Sanctification is not something our religious culture focuses on very much, perhaps because Sanctification requires us to change. This is worrisome, however because it is the very content of the vision cast by the Good News that the "kingdom is at hand":

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ² And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,

"See, the home of God is among mortals.

He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them;

⁴ he will wipe every tear from their eyes.

Death will be no more;

mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away."

Revelation 21:1-5 (NSRV)

The point is, Grace comes to find us where we are, but never leaves us there. In my homily on Palm Sunday (trinityumcmemphis.org/sermons), I reiterated a statement made by my own pastor, the Rev. Dr. David Lowes Watson, some years ago at West End UMC in Nashville: "There is no prerequisite for grace; but there *is* a post-requisite!" Simply, the gift of grace is meant to be *used* and comes with a user's guide: a little anthology otherwise known as the New Testament. Sanctification is what is revealed in Jesus himself; Sanctification is that journey toward life to which Jesus calls us. At the heart of this eternal work of love we find the spiritual practice of Sabbath.

But now more than ever the word about Jesus spread abroad; many crowds would gather to hear him and to be cured of their diseases. But he would withdraw to deserted places and pray.

Luke 5:15-16

So where do we go from here? Confident in God's everlasting life:

We take up the crosses the world will present to us when we do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly along side he who is the "pioneer and perfecter of our faith."

We continue seeking for the Sabbath of the LORD in the midst of the chaos of this life: we seek the order necessary for created life from the source of living water – the very heart of God.

We use what we've learned: that the season of Lent, in the year of our LORD 2016, has not been a parentheses or a culmination or an intellectual query, but the beginning of something new – for that which has been defiled and wounded by Evil is passing away.

We remain in perpetual remembrance that God is the audience for every moment of our lives.... Or as St. Paul says...

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. ²⁷ But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; ²⁸ God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, ²⁹ so that no one might boast in the presence of God. ³⁰ He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, ³¹ in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

Fear no darkness, dear friends, for the Living God is with us and holds up a lamp before us on the way of salvation, the way that leads to life. Blessed be our God forever for this grace!
