I just got back from dropping my oldest off at the Cannon Center for the Performing Arts downtown. He'll be there all day long for a rehearsal for a big city-wide performance that's tomorrow evening. Cooper has a solo. He'll be singing in front of a thousand people. Growing up in front of and around church people has given him the confidence to shine. Thank you for that

I drove home in the rain. I didn't know we were expecting rain. In fact, the weather forecast yesterday reflected that there wouldn't be rain until Friday and now, the only day it ISN'T raining is Thursday. The God who loves me hath heard my cries. *Thursday is soccer practice*.

Driving through the rain got me thinking. Rain has that power over me. Yesterday the seasons changed from Winter to Spring, and with Spring comes this rain, and with Spring comes Easter, and the two are so beautifully, and symbolically, connected. Rain has a cleansing power. It washes over Memphis and little yellow streams of pollen make their way to the drainage ditches. Thanks be to God.

Water washes us clean too. We ought to know this well, having spent the last 3 years washing the very skin off our hands all day long — washing the Covid germs away. But even further...

We sing of that washing, cleansing power that comes from Jesus. "What can wash away my sins? Nothing but the blood of Jesus." That's a tough metaphor for our younger disciples and, at Trinity, we don't sing the 'blood hymns' that much, but consider what Jesus did on the night of the Last Supper. He threw a towel over his shoulder, knelt, and washed the feet of his disciples, telling us to go do likewise. Go and offer the cleansing power of love, mercy, and forgiveness to others in his name.

Scripture points us over and over to the cleansing power of water and Spirit. John the Baptist was offering water to those who'd wade into the Jordan that they might prepare themselves for the one who would come and wash them clean with the Spirit. And let's not forget the transformative power of water, too. It's the prophet Amos who said, "Let justice roll down like water and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." (Amos 5:24) Water gives us life, and without it we wither. May we ne'er forget the moments the water of life left Jesus' body when they pierced his side.

And so as we approach Easter and move closer to Holy Week, as the rain falls outside and the fresh smell of newness washes over us when we step out into the shower, may we pause amid the busyness of the day and offer prayers of thanksgiving to the God who gives us life, who washes us clean, and who offers us these steady, Springtime reminders of life abundant in Jesus.

The Easter Bunny will be hopping around, mixing and mingling and offering photo ops for the children and their families. Many thanks to the Evergreen Historic District Association for partnering with us once again on this fun event.

The hunt will begin promptly at 2:00, so parents and grandparents need to get their children to the hunt early, not late! This fun event will take place rain or shine; it will happen inside the building, should we have a rainy day.


Support the Lakeshore Scholarship Fund

Fishes and Loaves Food Pantry at Binghampton UMM, 258 N. Merton St., is open on Tuesdays and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. for distribution of fresh fruits and vegetables....people can come as often as they want for these.

Once a month, folks can request an emergency food bag (canned goods, peanut butter, cereal, rice, dried beans, soup, etc). Neither of these options require any proof of residency or need.....you ask, you receive. Individuals and families who need an emergency food bag can call Michael Anderson at (901) 503-2748.
